

Notes from the Editor

Astute readers of the journal will have noticed some recent changes. Having established *Environmental Ethics* forty-two years ago, Eugene Hargrove stepped down as the editor in chief. After working on the transition for some time from behind the scenes, my name appeared on the journal as the editor in chief beginning with Volume 43.

With this transition, two specific changes are noteworthy. First, still basically following the *Chicago Manual of Style*, the journal has switched its citation style from the “notes and bibliography” system (full bibliographic information appearing in footnotes) to the “author-date” system (in-text citations with full bibliographic information in a reference list). The journal modifies the *Chicago Manual of Style* author-date system in one way: in-text citations should separate the year from the page with a colon, not a comma. For example, (Rolston 1994: 115–116).

Second, because of increasing uncertainty about the availability of colored cover stock, print copies of the journal will henceforth have a new look. Traditionally, the full cover of the four issues annually was stock paper with a seasonally appropriate color: green for spring, yellow for summer, tan for fall, and white for winter. Beginning with Volume 44 the cover stock of all issues will be white but the ink used for the cover text will vary seasonally: green for spring, burnt orange for summer, brown for fall, and blue for winter. Circumstances have made some changes to the cover unavoidable and this new style seemed the best option. The all-white cover will remain plain and uncoated, instead of patterned and glossy, and each issue will still exhibit (a more subtle) seasonal color variation.

Of final note, with this first issue of Volume 44 (2022) the journal thanks three outgoing members of its Editorial Advisory Board for ten years of service: James Garvey of the Royal Institute of Philosophy, Konrad Ott of Christian-Albrechts-Universität zu Kiel, and Nathan Kowalsky of St. Joseph’s College, University of Alberta. At the same time, we are very pleased to welcome four new members: Julia Gibson of Antioch University New England, Mike Hannis of Bath Spa University, Helena Siipi of the University of Turku, and Toby Svoboda of Fairfield University.
