Academy Edition Update: The makeup of the text of III,5 (mathematical, scientific and technical correspondence, 1691-1693) has been finished. Now the indices are complete; the volume will be given to the publisher's house in December and will appear in March 2003. The final redaction of volume I,18 (general, political and historical correspondence, January -August 1700) has considerably advanced; this volume and volume VII,3 (mathematical writings: infinite series 1672 - 1676) are to be expected next.

The internet presentation has been extended. Three published volumes, namely I,17; IV,2 and IV,4, can be seen on internet (respectively, <http://www.nlb-hannover.de/leibniz/veroeff.htm> and <http://www.bbaw.de/vh/leibniz/potsdam/index.html>). The Editionsstelle Potsdam offers in addition 670 pages of the future volumes IV,5 and IV,6. The Leibniz-Archiv Hannover offers the complete text (without indices) of the future volume I,18 and 942 pages of the future volumes I,19; I,20; III,5; III,6; VII,3. It may be recalled that the Editionsstelle Potsdam offers a cumulative subject index of the Academy edition on its homepage.
