

# PREFACE

The main theme of this volume 6 of *Eco-ethica* is “Ethics and Justice,” and most of the contributions are revised papers on this theme from the XXXVI<sup>th</sup> International Symposium of Eco-ethica, which was held from Monday, October 3, to Friday, October 7, at *the Swedish Research Institute* at Beyoğlu in Istanbul. The symposium included the following sub-themes: Ethics and personal justice, Ethics and social justice, and Ethics and metaphysical justice.

This symposium was arranged thanks to the Swedish Ambassador to Turkey, Lars Wahlund, the Consul General in Istanbul, Therese Hydén, the Director of the *the Swedish Research Institute in Istanbul*, Johan Mårtelius, and Professor Zeyep Direk, Koç University, Istanbul.

As usual, the third part consists of papers devoted to the philosophy of Paul Ricœur (1913-2005), written by Ricœur scholars. They all focus, in a way or another, on ethics and justice in Ricœur’s thought.

In fact, this journal is not only open to those who have participated in an Eco-ethica symposia but also to those who write on subjects in the field of eco-ethica.
