

## A NOTE ON THE CONTRIBUTORS

JAMES M. EDIE studied at the University of Louvain and the University of Paris, and now teaches philosophy at Northwestern University. He was instrumental in organizing the Society for Existential Philosophy and Phenomenology in this country. He has edited *What Is Phenomenology?* (Pierre Thévenaz's essays) and *An Invitation to Phenomenology*, and was co-editor of the three-volume *Russian Philosophy*.

HUBERT L. DREYFUS was born in Terre Haute, Indiana, in 1929 and received his Ph.D. from Harvard University. He is the translator of Merleau-Ponty's *Sense and Non-Sense* and the author of "The Three Worlds of Merleau-Ponty" and "Wild on Heidegger." He is at present Associate Professor of Philosophy at Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

ZYGMUNT ADAMCZEWSKI was born in Poland in 1921 and has studied at the Universities of Innsbruck, London, Columbia, and Harvard. He is the author of *The Tragic Protest* and is at present Associate Professor of Philosophy at the University of Waterloo.

WILLIAM EARLE was born in Saginaw, Michigan, in 1919 and studied at the Universities of Chicago and Aix-Marseilles. He is the author of *Objectivity* and the translator of Karl Jaspers' *Reason and Existenz*. He is at present Professor of Philosophy at Northwestern University.

JOHN J. COMPTON was born in Chicago in 1928 and has studied at Yale University and the Universities of Louvain and Paris. He is the author of "On Understanding Science" and "Hare, Husserl, and Philosophic Discovery." He is at present Associate Professor of Philosophy at Vanderbilt University.

J. N. FINDLAY was born in Pretoria, South Africa, in 1903 and studied at the Universities of Oxford and Graz. He is the author of *Meinong's Theory of Objects and Values*; *Hegel: A Re-Examination*; *Values and Intentions*; and *The Discipline of the Cave*. He is at present Visiting Professor of Philosophy at the University of Texas.

THOMAS LANGAN was born in St. Louis in 1929 and studied at St. Louis University and the Institut Catholique de Paris. He is the author of *The Meaning of Heidegger* and *Merleau-Ponty's Critique of Reason*. He is at present chairman of the Department of Philosophy at Indiana University.

WILLIAM J. RICHARDSON, S.J., was born in Brooklyn in 1920 and received his Ph.D. from the University of Louvain. He is the author of *Heidegger: Through Phenomenology to Thought* and is at present Associate Professor of Philosophy at Fordham University.

GERALD E. MYERS was born in Nebraska in 1923 and studied at Brown University. He has edited *Self, Religion and Metaphysics* and is at present chairman of the Department of Philosophy at Long Island University.

FRANK A. TILLMAN was born in St. Louis in 1928. He studied at Columbia University and is the author of numerous articles on analytical philosophy, among them "Explication and Ordinary Language Analysis" and "Phenomenology and Philosophical Analysis." He is at present Associate Professor of Philosophy at Vassar College.

FERNANDO R. MOLINA was born in Miami, Florida, in 1930 and received his Ph.D. from Yale University. He is the author of *Existentialism as Philosophy* and contributed to *An Invitation to Phenomenology*. He is at present Associate Professor of Philosophy at Syracuse University.

FREDERICK J. CROSSON was born in Belmar, New Jersey, in 1926 and studied at the Universities of Notre Dame, Paris, and Louvain. He co-edited and contributed to *The Modeling of Mind* and *Philosophy and Cybernetics*. He is at present Associate Professor of Philosophy at the University of Notre Dame.

JOHN R. SILBER was born in San Antonio, Texas, in 1926 and studied at Yale University and the Universities of Oxford, London, and Bonn. He is the author of numerous studies on ethics and Kantian philosophy and is at present chairman of the Department of Philosophy at the University of Texas.

MAURICE NATANSON was born in New York City in 1924 and studied at the University of Nebraska and the New School for Social Research. He is the author of numerous books, among them *Literature, Philosophy and the*

*Social Sciences and Essays in Phenomenology*. He is at present Professor of Philosophy and Fellow of Cowell College at the University of California, Santa Cruz.

JOHN M. ANDERSON was born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, in 1914. He studied at the University of California, Berkeley, and the University of Illinois. He is the author of *The Individual and the New World* and has translated Martin Heidegger's *Discourse on Thinking*. He is at present chairman of the Department of Philosophy at The Pennsylvania State University.

JOHN E. SMITH was born in Brooklyn in 1921 and studied at Columbia University and Union Theological Seminary. He is the author of *Reason and God*, *The Spirit of American Philosophy*, and *Royce's Social Infinite*. He is at present Professor of Philosophy at Yale University.
