The Society for the Advancement of American Philosophy proudly announces that its 1990 Annual Meeting will be a **special international conference**, March 2 and 3, in **Buffalo**, and cordially invites the submission of papers. **(Please note the change of location.)** Papers on all areas of American philosophy are welcome, but especially sought for this meeting are papers concerning the theme:

"The American Philosophical Tradition as Interpreted and Used in Other Countries"

The Society will award its Douglas Greenlee Prize to the best paper presented by either a graduate student or a person holding a Ph.D. for no more than five years.

Papers are to be no more than twenty minutes reading time (12 pages), prepared for blind reviewing (author's name and affiliation on title page only), and accompanied by abstracts. Send **five** (5) copies of papers and abstracts to:
