March 9-11, 2006

The 2006 SAAP meeting will take place at the Sheraton Gunter Hotel in San Antonio, Texas. Your host is Texas State University-- San Antonio, together with Northwest Vista College, San Antonio. The Sheraton Gunter is one block from the San Antonio River Walk <http://thesanantonioriverwalk.com/>, and directly across the street from the Majestic Theater, home of the San Antonio Symphony. The discounted room rates are \$124 for single or double rooms. If attendees find lower room rates through a travel agent or on-line service, we ask that they identify themselves as SAAP attendees at check-in. This will have two benefits: first, we will receive credit toward our contracted room numbers, and second the attendee will receive free high speed internet.

The Gunter opened in 1909, and was recently renovated. The hotel has a small exercise room, a pool, and jacuzzi.
